### A Peek at Our Week

<u>Math</u>: We are still working with 10s and ones in the Coordinating Units Sequence. Students should be practicing comparing numbers (17 < 23) and ordering numbers (least to greatest, greatest to least). Students should also be practicing continuing and identifying patterns. For example 12 would come next in the pattern 3, 6, 9, \_\_\_\_\_. The pattern rule is +3. Please visit our Merrillville Favorites page on our school webpage. There are many games available in our "lab favorites" section that will help reinforce classroom skills.

Reading: We are beginning a new theme called "Thinking Like a Scientist". Students will learn how machines work through read alouds and other activities. Our comprehension strategy is synthesizing. Synthesizing is when students combine ideas from what is read and their own knowledge. Then students are able to create new ideas or opinions. You can look at synthesizing as a culmination of all comprehension strategies, but a higher thought process is required. We are working on common vowel teams in phonics (oo and ea).

<u>Writing:</u> Students will continue to revise their writing. After revising, they will be ready to edit! Editing includes checking for capitals and punctuation.

<u>Spelling:</u> A list can be found on the newsletter. Please practice words each night. **Tests will be every** <u>THURSDAY</u>.
